Many of the passwords are published on the website Sonomacountyaa.org, but some are not, and in those instances we haven't been able to help except to suggest reaching out to other meeting members. That is sometimes not helpful if the meeting is about to or already has started, since participants have their phones off during meetings. We would like to encourage groups to redouble efforts to disseminate passwords among group members. Any groups with confidential passwords are encouraged to email them to teleservice@sonomacountyaa.org so that we can have them available; if that is in accord with the group's conscience. These will not be published in any public forum, and would be provided only upon a particular caller's request.

Also, we encourage groups to keep us informed by email of any sudden change, e.g. going from Zoom to live meetings, changing passwords, etc. so that we can be helpful to callers seeking such information.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR GENERAL SERVICE ARCHIVIST

I have the privilege of serving as the Archives Chair for District 12, Sonoma County, and am grateful for this opportunity to share about Archives. The origination of AA Archives came from Bill in the early 50's. The "movement", as AA was known, was highly successful, and Bill felt the history of what occurred would be of value to future historians, in addition to AA itself. The original idea was not about a place to gather, preserve, and share – but about keeping the record straight and separating fact from fiction. Bill worked with Nell Wing, his secretary, on how to gather the information and organize it. He appointed her as our first AA Archivist in 1965, and it was then that our GSO Archives began to evolve. GSO Archives then opened its doors in 1975.

As a District archivist, I am responsible for collecting relevant items pertaining to Sonoma County, such as audio recordings of speaker shares, news clippings pertaining to AA, Big Books donated from private collections, and oral histories from our members. Also, as archivist I am working to follow and preserve Bill's vision in the collection of group histories for Sonoma County. We have a large collection of histories from groups in our county and would one day love to have the history of every group – no matter how old or new that group might be. Did you know that The Third Step group was an offshoot of Up the Steps? In 1989 some of the members of the Up the Steps group determined that it had gotten too big and there was not enough room, so they decided to create a new group. Here is the description of the first meeting of The Third Step Group: Two people were present. There was one Big Book; two cups of coffee; and two cigars! And the River Women's group in Guerneville, which was founded in 1988 had almost no one attending in 2008. But the then tiny fellowship refused to close its doors and today thrives, thanks to the persistence and faith of its members.

Keeping with Bill's vision, we are currently experiencing unprecedented times in AA, and in the world. It is essential to capture our experiences now, so that current and future members of AA may learn and grow from our experiences. Tell us your challenges and your triumphs. How have your meetings been affected? If your meeting continues to meet, what does attendance look like? Are there visitors or speakers from other parts of the country or the world? Are steering committee meetings being held? And how is the message being carried to the

newcomer and the still suffering alcoholic?

As Bill said, there are stories galore, right here in Sonoma County, and these stories can serve to inspire, educate and enlighten us. The District and Area Archivists would love to hear you. Archivists preserve the message, so that all of us can continue to carry the message.

I make as many calls as it takes to connect speakers and presenters to each school that asks for us to come. The conversations I have with my AA brothers and sisters, most of whom I've never met face to face, come naturally and easily. The schools are so grateful for our efforts. It is so rewarding to me to perform this simple role and to be of use in carrying our message and perhaps, by the grace of God, perhaps planting a seed in the mind of a young person. -Diana M.
