BRIDGING THE GAP

Did you know that Bridging the Gap is nothing like H&I? Hospitals & Institutions brings A.A. meetings into facilities because inhabitants aren't able to leave for outside meetings. Bridging the Gap, however, makes presentations at facilities about what A.A. does and doesn't do, then offers participants the opportunity to complete a confidential contact card with their name, age, contact info, and a release date, so that BTG can hook them up with a volunteer in their own community who will get them to an A.A. meeting first thing upon their release, on their home turf! That's the gap that's being bridged by BTG. We all know how treacherous it is after leaving a rehab, hospital or jail; to not go directly to the lifestyle that got us into the facility in the first place.

If you're interested being a BTG volunteer, come to our monthly business meeting on the 3rd Tuesday of the month at the Bookstore. New member orientation begins at 6:00pm and the business meeting goes from 6:30-7:30pm. You can volunteer to be on the list of volunteers to be called (matched by gender, age & zip code), or be a presenter at one of the facilities, or serve on a BTG committee that participates in the monthly business meeting.

Any way you look at it, BTG is a "pedal to the metal" service commitment, doing core Twelfth step work. Hope to see you on the 3rd Tuesday! That's where any questions you have can be answered. ~Linda W.

OFFICERS REPORTS:

Chair: (Barry D.) Intergroup is extremely important to our fellowship.

Vice Chair: (James C.) Barry D. filled in. There was a great orientation tonight with 12 new reps.

Secretary: (Patrick B.) Minutes from May 2017 SCIF business meeting were passed.

Treasurer: (Joseph J.) Absent – Carolyn filled in. Group contributions for June were \$4,753, plus \$1 interest from the bank, for a total of \$4,754, which was \$1,985 less than May of last year (2016). After expenses we had a net profit of \$1,382. Bookstore income was \$5,816, and after expenses we had a net loss of \$334. Overall, we had a net gain of \$1,108, and year to date we are \$2,109 behind where we were last year (June 2016).

Registrar: (Linda W.) As of today's date, there are 239 groups in Sonoma County offering 359 meetings each week. There are 160 meeting representatives on record, for 67% participation. There were 72 representatives attending the June 2017 General Meeting, for 45% participation. There were 12 new reps attending the June 2017 meeting.

ICSC: (Esther S.) We are a sub-committee of Intergroup. Finally we have found a CPA to hire, and yearly reviews have been completed.

BOOKSTORE REPORT: (Glenn C.) The bookstore will be closed on July 4 to celebrate Independence Day. There will not be a book on sale for the months of July or August. We are currently recruiting for volunteers to staff the cashier desk at the bookstore four hours every other week. The sobriety requirement is one year and experience with retail sales and/or computer software is desirable. If you are interested, please come into the bookstore and fill out an application.
