**Minutes** of last month's meeting were approved.

**Registrar:** Deborah reported that she is working on database.

## LIAISON REPORTS

**H&I:** The H&I NCAA will occur in Yuba City from October 1<sup>st</sup> thru the 3<sup>rd</sup> and the H&I 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual will be held in Galt April 22-24<sup>th</sup>, 2005. Contributions to the Pink Can from our local Area 22 for September 2004 amounted to \$2,950.00 and year-to-date contributions amount to a whopping \$29,882.00 from our local Area 22 alone.

**General Service:** Donna K. reported that Area Elections will occur in Watsonville October 30<sup>th</sup> and Local District 12 Elections will occur on November 1<sup>st</sup>. The General Service Conference Literature Committee is soliciting stories from young people aged 13-15 years old to be considered for an update of the AA Pamphlet, *Young People and AA*; the deadline for submission is January 5, 2005. Additionally, the General Service Conference is soliciting stories from AA Spanish speaking members to be considered for the 3<sup>rd</sup> edition of the Spanish language Big Book *Alcoholicos Anonimos* with a deadline for submission being September 5, 2005. Contact the GS office or go online to [AA.org](http://AA.org) to submit. The following General Service motion was passed: "That the delegate for panel 55 be funded to the international conference in Toronto in 2005, not to exceed \$600.00". The following motion failed: "That no area officer be required to attend a District meeting". Donna announced that she will be

bringing a new General Service Liaison to Intergroup next month and reminded Intergroup Reps that if their group has a GSR to please allow the GSR to give the GSR report.

**PI/CPC:** Dave explained that the function of this committee and that they have been distributing literature to hospitals, police stations, etc. They are currently doing educational presentations at 12 + DUI classes per month and had a table at the health fair held at Santa Rosa Junior College last month.

**Treasurer:** John S. has been hospitalized for pneumonia, so Bob K. directed everyone to page 5 to review monthly financial report. He also explained that most of costs are for providing free newsletters, meeting schedules and the Teleservice hotline. He said there was a \$1700.00 loss for last month and a Year to Date loss of \$2825.00. He explained the purposed of the prudent reserve and the necessity of group to keep things running.

**Bookstore:** Gloria announced that John is under doctor's orders not to return to work until at least December. World Services has increased the prices for books/literature, so our prices will be increased effective October 15<sup>th</sup>. Bookstore volunteers are needed during the mornings on Mondays, afternoons on Wednesdays and the third Saturday of each month as well as during inventory on the last day of the month. 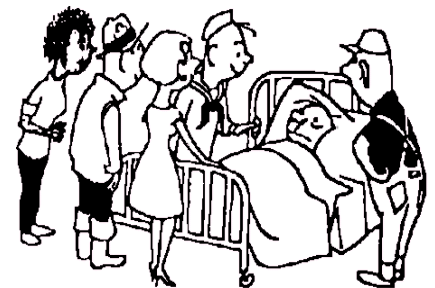


# HOSPITALS & INSTITUTIONS

"I saw that I had been living too much alone, too much aloof from my fellows, and too deaf to that voice within. Instead of seeing myself as a simple agent bearing the message of experience, I had thought of myself as a founder of A.A. How much better it would have been had I felt gratitude rather than self satisfaction - gratitude that I had once suffered the pains of alcoholism, gratitude that a miracle of recovery had been worked upon me from above, gratitude for the privilege of serving my fellow alcoholics, and gratitude for those fraternal ties which bound me ever closer to them in a comradeship such as few societies of men have ever known.

"Truly did a clergyman say to me, "Your misfortune has become your good live to become elder statesmen. They become the real and permanent leadership of A.A. In all other respects, however, I am sure that my own experience was essentially like that received by

any A.A. member who has strenuously practiced our recovery program. Surely, the grace he receives is also of God; the only difference is that he becomes aware of his gift more gradually."

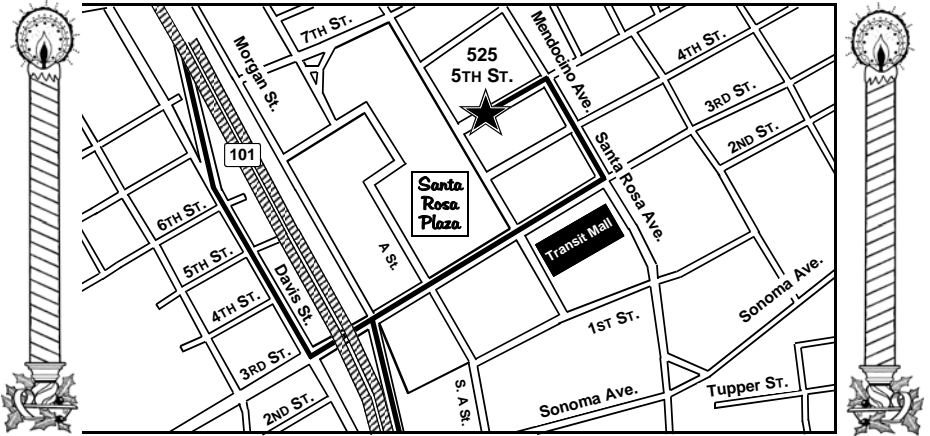

## Chairperson

Presides over monthly Intergroup and Steering Committee meetings. Maintains direct communication regularly with other Intergroup officers and committee chairpersons. Must have general knowledge of A.A. Service Manual & Robert's Rules of Order (for conducting Intergroup Business Meeting).

Length of continuous sobriety - 4 years.  
Average monthly commitment: 8-12 hrs.

## Vice-Chairperson

Assists Chairperson in his or her duties; attends all meetings. Attends all committee meetings. Conducts orientation meetings for new S.C.I.F. members which are held prior to regular S.C.I.F. meeting.

Length of continuous sobriety - 4 years.  
Average monthly commitment: 8-12 hrs.

## Treasurer

Pays S.C.I.F.-related bills. Collects and records contributions from groups and prepares monthly financial statements for inclusion in the Newsletter. Accounting background and computer literacy are helpful.

Length of continuous sobriety - 4 years.  
Average monthly commitment - 15+ hrs.

## Secretary

Attends regular S.C.I.F. meetings and takes minutes. Delivers correct copy of minutes to Newsletter Editor. Attends Steering Committee meetings.

Length of continuous sobriety - 3 years.  
Average monthly commitment: 4-6 hrs.


## Registrar

Maintains a list of groups and meetings available within the County. Keeps track on a monthly basis of which groups have representatives and how often reps attend meetings. Works with Outreach Committee to contact those groups that are not active in S.C.I.F. meetings.

Average monthly commitment: 10-12 hrs.

**NOTE:** *Term length for all jobs is one year. Officers can be elected for two consecutive terms.*

another? I want be there when the voice at the other end says, "I need help, I think I have a problem with drinking, can you help me?" Whenever possible, I assist each caller, especially calls from women. When I can't, I may call a friend. When a man calls and needs to talk I will call someone on the 12-Step list and have him talk to the caller. If no one is available from the 12-Step list I will call a program friend.

Most of the time I don't know to what degree the message has gotten through. There are those rare and wonderful times when someone will come up and tell me they know me from the Hotline. In a meeting someone will say, "I know you. My name is so and so, remember me? You were there for me when I called the Hotline, thank you for what you did for me; I am doing this and that and I am sober today!"

"Are your Berrine? My friend called and told me that you said you would be here at this
