It's SCIF election time! In January, we will be holding elections for our Intergroup officers; in February, we will elect new committee chairs. Because each of us is limited to two one-year terms, some of us must be replaced.

Do you have the time? Can you make the time? Ask yourself, "If not me, then who?" What better way to show your gratitude than to be available to serve Sonoma County AA?

JOB DESCRIPTIONS

SCIF CHAIR

Responsibilities are to conduct the monthly Intergroup General Meeting and the Steering Committee Meeting, prepare agendas for those meetings and research background information for issues that may arise at those meetings. Experience conducting business meetings according to Robert's Rules of Order, SCIF business procedures, and AA Traditions is important. The sobriety requirement is four years.

SCIF VICE-CHAIR

Responsibilities are to welcome new representatives to Intergroup, assist the chair and be able to step into that position if need be. The sobriety requirement is four years.

SECRETARY

Requires showing up at two meetings each month – the SCIF General and Steering Committee meetings. The secretary listens carefully, takes notes, and then types them up for SCIF Officers and Committee Chairs. The sobriety requirement is three years.

TREASURER

The job consists of depositing group contributions, paying bills, overseeing the bookkeeping and financial reporting and serving as a member of the ICSC. The treasurer attends the 4th Monday SCIF General Meeting and the 2nd Monday SCIF Steering Committee Meeting. The 2nd Monday meeting is preceded at 6:30 PM by the monthly ICSC Meeting which the treasurer also attends. Minimum of four years sobriety and an accounting background.

REGISTRAR

Maintains a list of groups and meetings available within the County. Keeps track on a monthly basis of which groups have representatives, meeting changes and how often reps attend meetings. Works with Outreach Committee to contact groups that are not active in S.C.I.F. meetings. The sobriety requirement is three years.

I am responsible. When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there. And for that: I am responsible.

NEWSLETTER EDITOR NEEDED

My commitment is coming to an end, so we will need someone to step up for the election in February. This position requires some computer skills and an interest in publishing, so I want to get the word out early. It would be good if we can find a few people with the requisite skills - it would be nice to have some backup in case of schedule conflicts.

DESCRIPTION : COMMUNICATIONS CHAIR - NEWSLETTER EDITOR

Coordinates efforts needed to produce Directories, Newsletter, & Web Site; gets meeting updates from Directory Coordinator for inclusion in monthly Newsletter. Arranges for printing and distribution of schedules & Newsletter. Coordinates Newsletter mailing to paid subscribers. Attends Steering Committee meetings, S.C.I.F. meetings, special events, and workshops when possible. Is aware of information that needs to be presented to membership in written form, especially SCIF business & events. Average monthly commitment: 20+ hrs.

SONOMA COUNTY INTERGROUP FELLOWSHIP GENERAL MEETING

Open mtg at 8:01pm with Serenity Prayer

Intro of New Reps:

New reps will be published next month

Officer Reports:

Treasurer: (Shirley J) Group contributions of \$1,778 were disappointing for the month of September less than the previous year by \$708. Group supported expenses exceeded income by \$2,818, Bookstore expenses exceeded income by \$557, Activities income exceeded expenses by \$433, resulting in a \$2,942 net loss overall.

Chair: (Sean M) Once again we have had a month where group supported expenses did not break \$2,000. As reported earlier in the year group contributions have been down all year and the steering committee informed the groups that they were keeping an eye on the prudent reserve. This past month Group contributions were \$2,818 less than the group supported expenses. That brings the operating prudent reserve to \$23,016 (3.7 months, 61.8%) which is \$14,210 less than what the operating prudent reserve is set at 6 months which is \$37,226. At the past steering committee meeting on October 11, 2010 the committee decided to take a few measures to cut the costs of the central office. The first thing the committee decided to do is cut the number of newsletters we print from 2800 to 2000, since we pay \$.20 per newsletter this will be a savings of \$180 per month, the steering committee is also suggesting to groups to please not waste meeting schedules and only take what you need. The next measure the steering committee decided to bring to the Intergroup reps to decide in a house keeping motion to remove the Teleservice add in the Press Democrat a savings of \$235 per month. The steering committee decided this was an item that could be removed that would least affect the members of Sonoma County Intergroup fellowship, since the Teleservice numbers are listed in the phone book, on the meeting schedule, and online, and that the Press Democratic ad may not be used as much as it once was. The steering committee is also in the process of looking at other ways to save money.

Housekeeping Motion:

To drop the AA hotline (Teleservice) ad in the Press Democrat saving Sonoma County Intergroup Fellowship \$225.00 per month. Objection. Item moves to new business next month.

Vice Chair: (Doug S) not present/no report

Recording Secretary: (Siobhan S) September minutes were accepted with a correction for clarity.

Registrar: (Rich S) In September we had 359mtgs/week, 192 reps, for 54% group representation

Bookstore Report (and ICSC): (Steve B) Bookstore is doing well. Prices have been adjusted. ICSC is going well. Bookstore hours changing Nov. 8 due to daylight savings.

The 12th Step: Extra Credit or Part of the Program?

The 12th Step suggests we carry this message. Having done the previous 11 steps and putting our own lives back on track to some kind of sane and useful purpose, there seems to be disparate attitudes towards the 12th step.

Some of you naturally talk to new people. You are gregarious and inviting. Now that you know you can help people through our program of recovery there's no stopping you. It doesn't mean you sponsor every person who walks in the door but you do sponsor a number of people and help many more. You are a great asset to our fellowship. It is rewarding work for all involved including yourself. Um ... This article isn't for you.

Then there are those of us who need some encouragement, prodding, and even a little instruction about how to carry this message. Just like all the other steps, the 12th step is yet another transforming step. Without it, the lifestyle change needed to overcome alcoholism is incomplete. The 12th step allows us to practice at becoming effective, responsible, and even generous members of AA and eventually the world around us. But if our nature is not outgoing, sometimes we conclude that 12th step just isn't our "thing".

AA never leaves us in a lurch instructing us to do something and not helping us get there. This is true with the 12th step. If you look at Bill and Dr. Bob's practice of the 12th step you will immediately find they started with what is now called Public Information / Cooperation with the Professional Community (PI/CPC) work. They talked to nurses, hospitals, and people around them about what was to become AA. Maybe you can follow in their footsteps. Today this is a committee where you can be instructed and helped about how to carry this message effectively.
