## SCIF COMMITTEE CHAIR POSITIONS

Term length for all jobs is one year. Two consecutive terms O.K.) — Recommended length of sobriety, all positions: two years. All Committee Chairs are required to attend SCIF Steering Committee and General Meetings.

**ACTIVITIES COORDINATOR:** Coordinates dances, summer picnics, and other activities and functions within Intergroup. Basically, puts the functions together.

**ALKATHONS CHAIR:** Secures site for and coordinates organization of Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Alkathons. Requires ability to recruit subcommittee chairs, delegate to them, and coordinate their efforts.

**COMMUNICATIONS COORDINATOR/NEWSLETTER EDITOR:** Coordinates efforts to produce and maintain monthly Newsletter and Directories. Conducts Communications meeting, works with Webmaster to keep website current.

**OUTREACH CHAIRPERSON:** Checks attendance for registered groups. Checks with groups to encourage groups to participate in the AA community and Intergroup.

**SEMINARS COORDINATOR:** Determines what workshops the Fellowship is interested in. Arranges for speakers and/or panels, schedules and promotes the seminars.

**TELESERVICE CHAIRPERSON:** Oversees day-to-day operations of Teleservice. Conducts monthly Teleservice business meetings.

This is repeated over and over, and unless this person can experience an entire psychic change there is very little hope of his recovery.

## BRIDGING THE GAP

---

Out with the old and in with the new. As the New Year begins so does the new General Service Panel #61. General Service Panels change every two years and with this brings a rotation of all the different service positions within the different entities that encompass General Service.

Hi everybody, my name is Allen H. and I am an alcoholic. I served on the Bridging the gap committee last panel as the out of area coordinator. Bridging the gap helps newcomers just being released from either a treatment facility, prison or jail get to an AA meeting in their home community by supplying a volunteer in that home community to take the newcomer to a meeting. This is usually done a day or two after the person returns home. When the person lives outside of our CNCA boundaries, then it was my job as the out of area coordinator was to find a contact in the newcomer's home town to take him or her to a meeting. Most of the people I have helped in the last two years were from somewhere in northern California or nearby states, but recently I had to find a contact for a girl returning to Marcellouis, France. Let me tell you the AA principles of love, tolerance and patience are alive all over this world. I have never talked to anyone unwell to help a newcomer. Helping the newcomer is what we do at BTG.

The Bridging the gap committee for district 12 meets on the third Tuesday of the month at the SCIF bookstore on Mendocino Avenue. Orientation for new volunteers begins at 6pm and the regular business meeting starts at 6:30. Anyone interested in being on a presentation team, taking a committee position or becoming a 12 step volunteer to take the newcomer to a meeting. A regular committee position might be a liaison to SCIF or H&I, alternate chair, out of area coordinator (like I was) or the 12 step volunteer coordinator.

The new committee is forming and we need new people. There is no experience required for any position. Suggested sobriety time is 6 months for a 12 step volunteer that has a working knowledge of the 12 steps. Come to our monthly meeting and check us out. We are looking forward to meeting you.

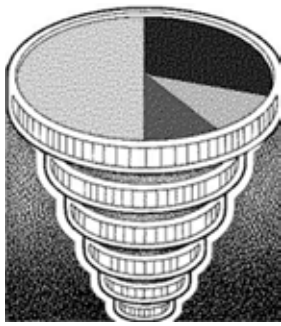
