INTERGROUP OFFICER POSITIONS

Officers will be elected at the Intergroup meeting on January 24th.

If you are interested in a great service commitment step up and run for office. What better way to show your gratitude than to be available to serve Sonoma County AA?

JOB DESCRIPTIONS:

SCIF CHAIR

Responsibilities are to conduct the monthly Intergroup General Meeting and the Steering Committee Meeting, prepare agendas for those meetings and research background information for issues that may arise at those meetings. Experience conducting business meetings according to Robert's Rules of Order, SCIF business procedures, and AA Traditions is important. The sobriety requirement is four years.

SCIF VICE-CHAIR

Responsibilities are to welcome new representatives to Intergroup, assist the chair and be able to step into that position if need be. The sobriety requirement is four years.

SECRETARY

Requires showing up at two meetings each month – the SCIF General and Steering Committee meetings. The secretary listens carefully, takes notes, and then types them up for SCIF Officers and Committee Chairs. The sobriety requirement is three years.

TREASURER

The job consists of depositing group contributions, paying bills, overseeing the bookkeeping and financial reporting and serving as a member of the ICSC. The treasurer attends the 4th Monday SCIF General Meeting and the 2nd Monday SCIF Steering Committee Meeting. The 2nd Monday meeting is preceded at 6:30 PM by the monthly ICSC Meeting which the treasurer also attends. Minimum of four years sobriety and an accounting background.

REGISTRAR

Maintains a list of groups and meetings available within the County. Keeps track on a monthly basis of which groups have representatives, meeting changes and how often reps attend meetings. Works with Outreach Committee to contact groups that are not active in S.C.I.F. meetings. The sobriety requirement is three years.

SCIF COMMITTEE CHAIR POSITIONS

Elections for the Committee Chairs will be held at the February meeting.

Term length for all jobs is one year. Two consecutive terms O.K.) — Recommended length of sobriety, all positions: two years. All Committee Chairs are required to attend SCIF Steering Committee and General Meetings.

ACTIVITIES COORDINATOR: Coordinates dances, summer picnics, and other activities and functions within Intergroup. Basically, puts the functions together.

ALKATHONS CHAIR: Secures site for and coordinates organization of Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Alkathons. Requires ability to recruit subcommittee chairs, delegate to them, and coordinate their efforts.

COMMUNICATIONS COORDINATOR/NEWSLETTER EDITOR: Coordinates efforts to produce and maintain monthly Newsletter and Directories. Conducts Communications meeting, works with Webmaster to keep website current.

OUTREACH CHAIRPERSON: Checks attendance for registered groups. Checks with groups to encourage groups to participate in the AA community and Intergroup.

SEMINARS COORDINATOR: Determines what workshops the Fellowship is interested in. Arranges for speakers and/or panels, schedules and promotes the seminars.

TELESERVICE CHAIRPERSON: Oversees day-to-day operations of Teleservice. Conducts monthly Teleservice business meetings.

Election of Recording Secretary Position: (Sean M) Our Secretary Siobhan S needed to give up her position due to work conflict. We are only filling the position through the term ending at our meeting in January. Sean handed over the running of the third legacy to Annie T. from General Service; she ran procedure during the reports. Availability for recording secretary position was established at the beginning of the meeting. Two-thirds (39) of the cast votes (58) were needed to obtain position. New Recording Secretary: Patty G 40, Chris S 18.

Officer Reports:

Chair: (Sean M) Not too much else to report. We have a lot going on this evening including new business we need to get to.

Vice Chair: (Doug S) Had a good orientation this evening. So much excitement -- right now we're crazy with activities.

Treasurer: (Shirley J) Group contributions of \$6,820 were encouraging for the month of October, \$1,826 more than October 2009. Group supported income, exceeded expenses by \$3,783. Bookstore income exceeded expenses by \$109, Activities' income exceeded expenses by \$1,092, and Seminar income was \$62, resulting in a \$5,046 net gain overall.

Registrar: (Rich S) In October, there were 358 AA meetings per week in Sonoma County. Of those, 125 or 34.9% were represented at the SCIF General Meeting. That's the lowest group representation I have seen this year. I will have chat with reps from big meetings. If you were new last month please make sure you fill out a form.

Bookstore: (Linda M) Our vendor raised the prices on aluminum and bronze chips so we have had to raise our prices accordingly. The Grapevine released a new publication – Spiritual Awakening II, More Journeys of the Spirit; copies are available at the bookstore. All bookstore volunteer shifts are now filled. The fourth quarter inventory will be held at 12 noon on Sunday January 2, 2011.

Committee Reports:

ICSC: (Trevor H) It's a pleasure to work with Steve B. our outgoing ICSC chair. We have researched and determined a better credit card for the bookstore to use in making purchases. The Bookstore's annual volunteer Christmas party may be canceled because the \$200 set aside for this event was part of the funds stolen earlier this year. There are a number of meetings that have not sent in contributions this year. We will be contacting them to see what the situation is. Linda and I are researching costs for a debit card/credit card sales option at the bookstore – we'll keep you informed.

Activities: (Kathy M) Halloween was a success – Thank you all who volunteered and attended. Next event will be New Year's – Dancing with the Stars. Donna L did a wonderful job on the fliers – thank you.

This event will be an AWESOME dinner and dance. The Spaghetti Dinner will be made by volunteers.

Alkathons: (Patty G) We still have a 4am slot at Christmas and 2am and 4am at New Years! If you are a night owl and would like to secretary a meeting please give Jimmie B a call.

Communications/Newsletter: (Brian Z) Newsletter position will be open - need to find people with computer skills to help.

Outreach: (Chris M) not present/no report

Seminars: (Karen M) Nov. 10th we held the seminar on Teleservice and it was excellent. We would like to do the seminar again in February and record it. The CDs sales box will be taken down during the Alkathons so they can use the box.

Recording Secretary: (Patty G) The October SCIF General Meeting minutes were approved without changes.

PICPC NEWS

One is enough

For the past dozen years I've been in service as a speaker, representing Alcoholics Anonymous to people attending the county's Drinking Driver Program. I do this through a committee known as PICPC, or Public Information (in) Cooperation with the Professional Community, a subcommittee of General Service. I find this form of service both interesting and rewarding.

The interest comes from getting out of my A.A. comfort zone and sharing my story with people outside the fellowship. The reward comes from staying sober myself, and holding out the hand of hope to anyone who may be feeling what I felt when I was struggling with my addiction.

The county invites us to speak at these classes, and over the years I've seen co-workers and a number of friends and acquaintances in the audience. They are usually shocked to see me, but I always assure the group that we respect their anonymity as faithfully as we protect our own. I also assure them that neither we nor the county make any judgment regarding their use of alcohol. Our purpose is to provide information only. We are not there on a recruiting mission.

To emphasize that fact I read them our Preamble. This eloquent document wipes out the myths and misconceptions, and it states our principles and purpose with such clarity that there is nothing left to fear or resent. The Preamble's truth and simple dignity inspire respect, and respect stimulates interest.

Have my efforts made a difference? I have no way of knowing. But if even one person has found hope from despair – it's been worth all the effort I've ever put into it. If you think this service might interest you please come to our next PI/CPC business meeting and check it out. Meetings are held at 7:30 P.M. on the second Wednesday of every month - at the Santa Rosa City Hall employees lounge, next to the underground parking garage. We look forward to seeing you.

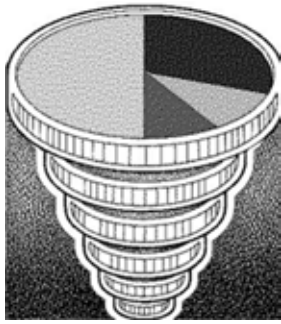
