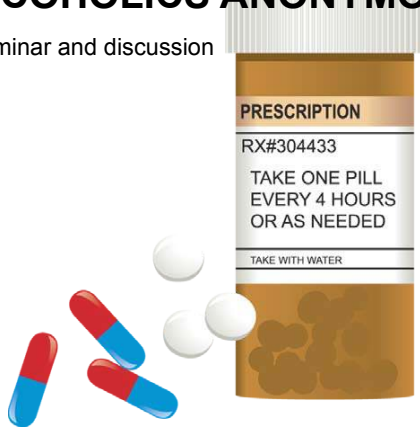

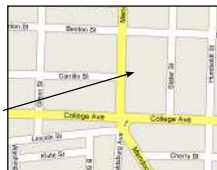

Chair: (Sean MCP) the new meeting schedules are out. They are yellow. If anyone has any questions or needs any help, please feel free to contact me.

Vice Chair: (Doug S.) I do the orientation for the new reps, we had 7 tonight. Intergroup serves the meetings, there is a lot of information given out, but please also bring your groups concerns.

Recording Secretary: (Siobhan S.) February minutes were accepted as printed with no corrections.

I would like to suggest that if you are making a report at this meeting, it is helpful to come with a written report. Not only does it make my job easier, it will make the meeting move more swiftly and help you to not forget what you wanted to say

Treasurer: (Shirley J.) Treasurers report for Feb. 2010:

Group contributions of \$2984 were slightly better in February than it was last year of \$2335. Group supported expenses exceeded contributions by \$824, Bookstore expenses exceeded income by \$430, and activities (Valentines Dance) lost \$489 resulting in a net loss of \$1743 for the month.

Registrar: (Rich S.) In Feb. we had 375mtgs/wk, with 121 reps in attendance. 32% representation is well below what we would like. Please make sure that you sign in so everyone is counted.

Bookstore Report: (Linda M.) We have groups coming in to buy multiple copies of books like Living Sober, AA Comes of Age, and As Bill Sees It and it would be helpful if I knew in advance how many of these titles the groups expect to need so that I could order them in advance.

We are going to conduct the first quarterly bookstore inventory on this coming Sunday March 28th starting at 12 noon. Anyone interested in helping with this inventory can call me at 546-2066.

All regular volunteer shifts at the bookstore are now full.

Committee Reports:

ICSC: (Gene H.) WE are researching a new computer purchase

Activities: (Kathy M.) Currently booking venues for this year's events. Sending a clipboard around for anyone who would like to volunteer at events. Also looking for any suggestions about what you would like to do.

Alkathons: (Maureen C.) not present/no report

Communications/Newsletter: (Brian Z.) All contact numbers and email are on the back page. Mtg changes are on inside of front page. There is a large announcement regarding the meetings at the S.R. Alano Club. Website is getting lots of traffic looking for meetings.

Outreach: (DeeDee S.) Sick. Not present/no report.

Seminars: (Karen M.) Seminar on March 31st at 6:30pm on the 10th Tradition. We have a great panel of 3 men, 2 of which have lots of experience dealing with the public.

Teleservice: (Rob S.) One open shift left. 5-10pm on Mondays. Interested in doing a seminar on Teleservice. Teleservice is always looking for volunteers.

Liaison Reports:

BTG: (Cassie S.) BTG meeting is on the 3rd Tuesday of the month. BTG is a subcommittee of Gen. Service and we go into institutions and give presentations and offer to connect to those leaving to get them to their first meeting in the community. We have about 30-50 opportunities to take individuals to meetings each month. We can always use volunteers to take people to meetings. I will be bringing yellow card next month, which are our sign-up card that can be sent in to us at BTG if you want to be on our list of volunteers.

H&I: (Will S.) We are always looking for speakers. You only need 6 mos. sobriety to speak at an unlocked facility, 2yrs. for a locked facility. I am looking for women to speak at Turning Point on Thursdays.

PI/CPC: (Nick R.) We distribute meeting schedules to emergency rooms, libraries and jails. We train speakers. The DDP program has been cut. We are reaching out to other agencies. We are doing presentations to principles of high schools, and are recruiting young people. We have lots of speakers, but need help on the committee.

SOCYPAA: (Billy S.) we just held our elections, Harmony G. is the new Chair, and Brian K. is the new Vice Chair.. May 1st we will be holding a toga party at the Petaluma Alano Club. Meeting from 7-8pm, dance at 8:30-12:30, \$10.

Access Sonoma County: (Margie A.) Plans are going forward for the Dual Diagnosis Workshop. We have the Big Book on CD available on loan for people who have reading or seeing problems. We are currently gathering info on assisted listening devices. Don't know if needed, as there has been no response from the groups.

General Service: (Annie T.) The Pre-Conference Assembly is being held in Cloverdale on April 10th and 11th at the Citrus Fairgrounds. There will also be a dinner on April 10th, with George D. as the speaker.]

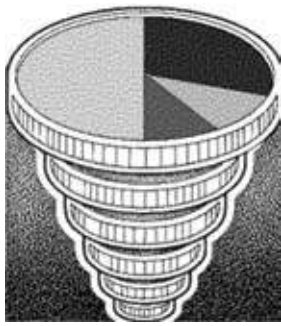
