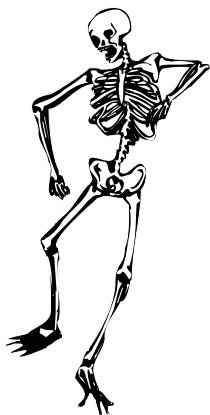

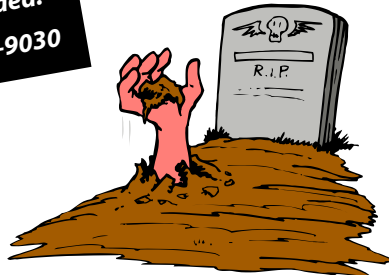

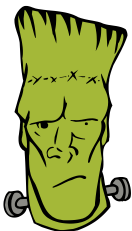

We provide updated literature to Police stations, libraries, Emergency rooms, Senior Centers, Court Houses and the like. One of our services is provide speakers knowledgeable about our recovery program to any institution desiring them. These speakers are A.A. members- former problem drinkers with some years of sobriety, and are well qualified to answer any questions about how alcoholics can recover in A.A. We would encourage younger members to get involved, or anyone for that matter.

The truth is that as energetic and enthusiastic as we on this committee, we are too few to accomplish all the tasks we have the potential to undertake. We are making progress though; doing some of our tasks by committee and not as individuals has helped. What we do, we do very well but it seems that there are things left untouched or unfinished through no fault of anyone's. We are already busy with our current tasks and life in general to do a whole lot more. So I invite anyone with some sobriety time and knowledge of the steps to join us. We have positions available; in helping to coordinate with Hospitality, Media and the Senior Community, not to mention the help that our current coordinators would love to have, even just to help distribute literature.

This month we will be putting together recently received literature for delivery by our committee to various senior residence communities throughout the county. PRUDENT RESERVE

As Sonoma County Intergroup Fellowship has grown over the years, we have increased the prudent reserve from time to time when funds were available for that purpose. Now, for the first time in our history, we are in the fortunate position of having enough funds to establish a truly appropriate level for our prudent reserve on an ongoing basis.

To build a legacy for future generations of AAs and provide a foundation so that our Central Office can continue its service, we propose a simple formula to calculate each year a prudent reserve, a calculation that allows for economic fluctuations. The following formula is therefore being proposed to the groups in the form of a motion presented at the September general meeting:

“Sonoma County Intergroup Fellowship, Inc. shall maintain a prudent financial reserve of six months’ operating expenses, excluding ‘cost of sales’. At the end of each year the treasurer shall calculate the new prudent reserve amount based on the past 24 months’ operating expenses divided by four and make the necessary accounting adjustment which will be published in the Annual Financial Statements.”

The newly established level of the prudent reserve will be reported at the January meeting and reflected in the full financial statements published in the newsletter each February. Had this formula been in effect all along our current prudent reserve, based on a six month average of 2007 and 2008 expenses, would be \$36,346. That represents an increase of \$6,346 over our current prudent reserve.

Once the method for determining the prudent reserve has been approved by the groups, we will propose a method for distributing any excess funds to other AA service entities.

HOSPITAL AND INSTITUTION COMMITTEE

“Areas of responsibility [in H&I] had to come into effect. Decisions had to be made in the fields of general chairman, regional chairman, area chairman, coordinators and contact chairmen. As more prisons, jails juvenile halls, honor farms, alcohol treatment centers, city and community psychiatric hospitals were opening the locked door to Alcoholics Anonymous, the purpose structure had to be set down. Yes, even rules, as we were guests of these facilities by mutual agreement.

“Then came our purpose, which you will find in the Pink Policy Book [aka the Pink Pamphlet]. It became necessary to set up procedures for providing all the needed literature: The Big Book, the 12 and 12, As Bill Sees It, Living Sober, Came to Believe, and all the Conference-Approved literature dealing with recovery. In the beginning, individuals provided it, but, as our responsibilities and facilities increased, so did our need for literature. Once again, the intelligence of a recovering alcoholic came upon an idea. Why not pass around a can at group meetings with the explanation that the pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters dropped into the can were to purchase literature for patients and inmates. And this was to be an individual donation to the Hospital and Institution Committee. So we now have our pink cans which are passed separately from the groups 7th Tradition on a voluntary basis—and it works. Today, our budget for literature is being met by all of you who want to contribute to this type of service work.” [From A Brief History of the Northern California Hospital and Institution Committee]

As you know, the people who pass around those pink cans are your meeting reps—liaisons to the Hospital and Institution Committee. This month, the following joined the ranks: Lupe, representing the Third Step Group; Melanie, the Shuman Lane Group (Petaluma); Jeff, South Park Survivors; Erin, Simply AA; Julie, A Vision for You; and Sydney, Tea and Recovery. Thank you all for being of service.

We also extend a warm welcome to our visitors: Harry, Ben, Virginia, Debra, Pam, Jessica and Neda—we hope you find something here that keeps you coming back!

As we’ve said before, we strongly believe that service helps keep you sober. Proof of this can be found in the 112 years of sobriety being celebrated by H&I members for the month of September.

Its not too early to mark your calendars for this year’s Unity Day on November 17—more to follow; check the newsletter for details.

“Unity, recovery and service” is written on the 5-year sobriety chip I carry with me at all times. I often feel that 4 of those years are a direct result of General Service. I have served as a GSR and now as DCM for one of District 12’s sub-districts. Part of my DCM job is to help GSRs learn and fulfill their roles in General Service. I’m also on a mission to help them tap into the fun (yes, you read this correctly) of General Service. I like to lead by example so I recently took three sister GSRs to the Summer Assembly Conference in Fortuna. In addition to our two-night slumber party, we all discovered the joy of spending a day with about 350 other fun loving General Service representatives and officers. We took care of General Service business and had a choice of attending 6 different workshops. I attended the workshops “Dogma in AA” and “Anonymity in the age of Electronic Media”. We all came away with a whole new respect for the timeless relevance of our Traditions. On the ride home we talked non-stop (remember... 4 women in a car) about these workshops and how they brought to life Tradition 5 and 12 respectively. Rigid doctrine has no place in AA if it detracts from carrying the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. And, anonymity is the spiritual foundation of our program.
