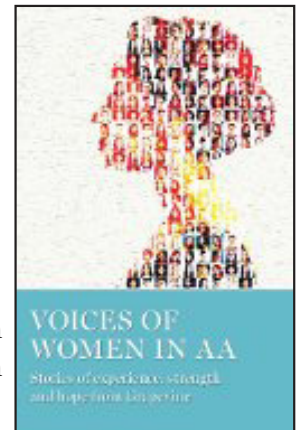
BOOKSTORE

Remember how summers used to last forever? How hard it was to wait for events when we were younger? Remember the excitement as the date drew nearer and nearer? At Access Sonoma County, we are revving up for October 21st. We've been planning and preparing for months (honestly...months!!), and it's almost here! We are presenting a three-hour workshop about Aging in Sobriety at St. Luke Lutheran Church on Saturday, October 21st, from 1 pm to 4 pm.

BRIDGING THE GAP

Looking to do 12th Step work? Bridging The Gap needs Volunteers!

Bridging the Gap (BTG) supports that very important first step for anyone who has just been released from a hospital, treatment center or correctional facility by providing temporary contacts who help the newcomer make the transition to Alcoholics Anonymous in his or her home community. Patients and inmates are often introduced to AA while in treatment or correctional facilities; however, they may not know how to proceed upon release, and sometimes find it difficult to reach out to AA on their own. Statistics show, however, that people just exiting an institution have significantly higher chance of staying sober if they get to a meeting immediately following their release. People who are about to be released from an institution can complete a card requesting a temporary contact of the same gender and age group who can take the newcomer to a meeting. Temporary contacts can also answer any questions that the newcomer has about AA and share information

about the importance of home groups, sponsors, and going to meetings.

In March I went to the monthly BTG Orientation to learn what it was all about, and I have never looked back! I volunteered as a temporary contact, got put into service and now have the privilege to present BTG at the Orenda Center once a month. BTG is the cornerstone of my AA commitments and service work.

Curious? I invite you to come to the monthly Orientation and check out Bridging The Gap – 3rd Tuesday of the month at the Bookstore – 6pm Orientation and 6:30pm District Meeting.

Secretary: (Patrick B.) Minutes from July 2017 business meeting were passed.

Treasurer: (Joseph J.) Group contributions for July were \$4,772, plus \$1 interest from the bank, for a total of \$4,773, which was \$1,240 less than July of last year (2016). After expenses we had a net profit of \$1,140. Bookstore income for July was \$6,893, and after expenses we had a net loss of \$304. Overall, we had a net gain of \$836 for the month of July, 2017. Year to date we are \$2,477 behind where we were last year (July 2016).

Registrar: (Linda W.) As of today's date, there are 235 groups in Sonoma County offering 355 meetings each week. There are 159 meeting representatives on record, for 67% participation. There were 69 representatives attending the July 2017 General Meeting, for 43% participation. There were 8 new reps attending the July 2017 meeting.

BOOKSTORE REPORT: (Glenn C.) The bookstore will be closed for Labor Day, September 4. The sale book for September is Spiritual Awakenings I; \$12.99 is the regular price; the sale price is \$10.39 plus tax. The book "Emotional Sobriety I" is now back in print and available for sale at the bookstore for \$12.99 plus tax. The bookstore has tested and will be using Square (an alternative form of taking credit card payments at remote locations) at Unity Day on September 30th.
