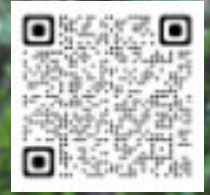

Registrar's Report for January, 2025

As of January 27th, 2025, there were 234 groups in Sonoma County offering a total of 417 meetings each week: 117 meetings were on Zoom, 278 were in-person, and 22 were hybrid.

A total 85 representatives attended the Jan. 27th Intergroup Meeting: 49 on Zoom 24 in person. Of the 14 new reps, 9 attended in person, 5 were on Zoom.

So if I buy a Rule 62 T-shirt or a silver necklace with a circle around a triangle or a funny mug or silly game, please don't call it Drunk Junk. It's part of a culture connected to a program that's saving my life.

On second thought, I guess I really don't care what you call anything that helps me stay sober. Live and let live, as lively as I can.

General Service Corner: Breaking the Ice

So there I was, on Zoom, listening to my fellow A.A.'s discuss matters of general service, and feeling like a fish out of water, a deer in headlights; like the "new kid" at school amongst what felt like an already established group of people who knew each other well. This was my very first officers meeting, and is one of the several new monthly commitments that has been added to my AA program as a District Committee Member (DCM).

As the meeting progressed, I listened to each trusted servant give their report, and tried my best to let the information wash over me without getting frantic. Upcoming topics to debate, the agenda topics workshop that is steadily approaching, next month's General Service business meeting agenda, and oh yeah, my report from the sub-district meeting to be forwarded to the recording secretary was past due. Whoops! I didn't get the memo on that one. This was like trying to drink water out of a firehose.

That feeling of wanting to be perfect and not letting on to anyone that I didn't know what I was doing was starting to take over my mind. I continued to listen to the information being presented and progressively felt overwhelmed. Then came the matter of who was going to write next month's General Service Corner article for the Intergroup newsletter; *this* article. The lull of silence thickened in the virtual room that our Zoom squares occupied. I took a deep breath, unmuted my mic, and mustered up the only words I could think of: something like, *I don't know what I would write about, but I would be willing to try.* Before I knew it, I had volunteered myself and felt the support of my fellows, who were all smiling and who also provided some helpful suggestions; my mind eased, and I felt more at peace, and my new role in general service started to feel a bit more manageable.

What I continue to learn, a lesson that presents itself repeatedly, is that when I ask for help in A.A., I return to my solution. Asking for help gets me out of my disease, out of returning to character defects, and out of myself. I am glad I leaned into my Higher Power. It broke the ice that prevented me from stepping into an already warm and welcoming milieu, provided me with some confidence, and showed me how my Higher Power continues to work on my life.

January 2025 Treasurer's Report

The bookstore income for January 2025 was \$9,853. Cost of goods total was \$6,758. Total expenses for January were \$3,663 for a subtotal **loss** of \$567.

Central Office income for January 2025 was \$9,094. Total expenses for January were \$4,461, for a subtotal **gain** of \$4633.

Intergroup Activities income for January 2025 was \$3,371. Expenses for January 2025 were \$900, for a subtotal **gain** of \$2471.

Overall, for January, there was an overall **gain** of \$6,537.

Year to date our income is \$22,319, total cost of goods is \$6,758, and our total expenses were \$9,024 leaving a **gain** of \$6,537.

What Group Contributions Are Used For:

Contributions to Intergroup pay for the Teleservice AA Hotline, SCIF website, newsletters, meeting schedules, the intergroup activities such as Alkathons, Unity Day, and seminars. Intergroup also pays 50% of the overhead for the central office including rent for the intergroup meeting on the 4th Monday of each month.

Bookstore sales pay for all the literature and amenities, the licensing fees and its 50% of the Central Office overhead which includes office rent, utilities, insurance, bookkeeping and the payroll. *None of the group contributions are used to purchase any of the bookstore inventory.* Bookstore sales pay for the bookstore inventory. But Intergroup does reimburse the bookstore for the AA pamphlets given free to groups.
