

# SCIF General Meeting Minutes for January 26, 2026

Meeting opened with Serenity Prayer, readings of the preamble by Gary, Tradition 1 by Renee, & Concept 1 by Alex.

Representatives were asked to sign in.

## MEMBERS & REPRESENTATIVES COMMENTS

Noel announced that an ad hoc committee to create a Step-Working guide that will have its first meeting at the bookstore on Feb 1 .at 6 pm. and invited others to join.

Travis shared that singleness of purpose made service and Intergroup important.

## ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Maureen G. facilitated the Third Legacy procedure, as found on pg. 144 AA Service Manual. James B., Jonny W., and Ben G. helped. Joshua P. was elected for a 2<sup>nd</sup> term as Chairperson, Scott M. for Vice-Chair, Shannon T. for Secretary, Mike H. for a 2<sup>nd</sup> term as Treasurer, and Angel P. for Registrar.

## OFFICER REPORTS

**CHAIR: Joshua P.-** no report.

**VICE CHAIR: Angie G.-** no report.

**SECRETARY: Amy P., Angie substituted-** Minutes from December were recorded and transcribed by AI and will be presented for approval at next month's general meeting.

**TREASURER: Mike H.-** referred to the February newsletter, reviewing the accounting on page 5 and the AI-generated comparison of 2023 and 2025 finances on page 8.

**REGISTRAR: Stacy T.-** On Dec.22, 2025, there were 468 total meetings, 250 unique groups. 335 mtgs were in-person, 109 on Zoom, 24 hybrid. Intergroup rep attendance: 38 total: 23 in-person 7 online, (7 new) which was down 2% from November. Mentioned that the webmaster Jay announced that the recording tool is making errors. Once corrected, a drop in total meetings would likely occur.

**ICSC REPORT: Joann L. via Joshua P.-** Annual plan and process procedure for the Bookstore is being discussed

**BOOKSTORE: Bob F.-** Bookstore and Meeting Hall is expanding the means to carry the message, can help groups needing a GSO number or an IRS EIN. AA is raising the cost \$3 per book and 15% for media and service materials.

The Meeting Hall has many time slots available for meetings and sober events. Asked for donations to build wall mount pamphlet rack. Expressed gratitude for the \$7000 that had been donated to the Meeting Hall.

**ACTIVITIES: Alan A.-** Valentine's Dance to be co-hosted with SOCYPA at Alano Club, DJ Blackout. Proposed budget \$650.

**NEWSLETTER: Arjuna-** Call for old slogans. Deadline Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> of February at 5:30pm.

**ALKATHONS: Isabelle L.-** SCIF made \$2875.26 for all three alkathons, H&I got \$237.02. Thanked specific groups for doing awesome jobs.

**WEBMASTER: Jay F.-** Explained that the inconsistencies Registrar Stacy mentioned were due to Spanish meetings were being included in the SCIF number but they have their own intergroup. Asked newly-elected officers to send him their contact info.

**SEMINARS: Clark W.-** Last seminar in the new meeting hall was a big success. It took in \$61.75. Rent was \$30. "We Are Not a Glum Lot" is an idea for next seminar.

**ICSC NOMINATING COMMITTEE: Greg A.-** absent.

**TELESERVICE: Maria S.-** All shifts covered. She also pitched a "New Topic" meeting at SCIF Meeting Hall 3:30 Tuesdays.

**TECH: Jake H.-** All tech for the general meeting is finally working well.

In 2<sup>nd</sup> month holding speaker meetings at Align Recovery. Bidding for ACYPAA, All California Young People of AA, need written statement of support from Intergroup Chair. SOCYPA shirts on sale at bookstore.

**GENERAL SERVICE: Maureen-** Flyer in newsletter for Panel 75 Agenda Topic Workshop. We will send Chitra to the NorCal Area 06 to conference in April. Your GSR reps must learn how to collect your groups' consciences. A visiting office reported on "Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix," a new pamphlet. ### The General Service Rep (GSR) and General Service Conference Agenda Topics Season

One of the main responsibilities of your group's GSR is to collect your group's "Group Conscience" about the General Service Conference Agenda Topics. The GSR gathers group consciences from your group and then attends a Pre-Conference Area Assembly in early April where they share those group consciences with our Area Delegate.

Our Area, the California Northern Coastal Area, or CNCA, is one of 93 Areas in the US and Canada that sends a delegate to the General Service Conference.

The General Service Conference is a week long meeting held every year in April in New York. The Conference is where the voice of AA Groups advises the Trustees of the General Service Board on a wide range of topics like Literature, Grapevine/La Viña, Corrections, Public Information, Finance, etc.

After the Conference, your GSR attends a Post-Conference Area Assembly in May where they hear the Delegate talk about what decisions were made at the Conference. They are then tasked with bringing that information back to your group, especially the outcome of the Agenda Topics your group discussed, and any that they think are important to share with the group.

Another way for everyone to hear about the Conference from our Delegate is to attend the Sonoma County General Service *Delegate's BBQ*, which will be held this year on June 1<sup>st</sup> at Faith Lutheran Church on Newanga. It's open to everyone in the Fellowship and you're guaranteed to see someone from the Fellowship that you haven't seen for a while. There's a Potluck and BBQ from 6:00-7:30, and then the Delegate shares their Conference experience from 7:30-9:15.

Finally, a Conference Report comes out in the Fall. It's available online at AA.org, and your GSR can usually get a hard copy to share with your Group.

## What's New

**School Outreach is Growing.** Schools Coordinator Ed G. and team are presenting regularly at Petaluma High, Casa Grande High, with strong teacher support. Students are engaged, asking great questions, and expressing real gratitude. But out of roughly 35 junior highs and high schools in Sonoma County, we're only at two. If you know a teacher, counselor, or administrator who could help us get into more schools, please reach out.

**Speaker Training.** Available at 7:00 PM ahead of the monthly business meeting (2nd Wednesday). New speaking dates run through May, including in-person opportunities at the Orenda Center for the Drunk Driving Program. Observers and new speakers are being added to the rotation. If you've thought about carrying the message through a PI/CPC speaking commitment, now is a great time.

## Why I Do PI/CPC Work

I've always been in service. I still hold a regular H&I commitment. But when the pandemic hit and meetings shut down, everything changed. I jumped into new service positions out of pure need: the need to connect, the need to carry the message. It was whelming in the face of all that fear and uncertainty.


I hadn't expected what came next. I had never been willing to be public about being a member of AA. That was a line I just hadn't crossed. But with everything locked down, my need to be useful outweighed my comfort zone.

PI/CPC became a bright spot. My first panel had maybe eight people, and we figured it out together. What I found was real joy in carrying the message in a new way: into schools where teenagers are hearing about alcoholism for the first time, into conversations with professionals who didn't know what AA does, into senior centers and veterans organizations where people are quietly struggling.

When a high school teacher tells you your speakers made a difference in her classroom, or a committee of volunteers stays an extra 30 minutes to figure out how to reach one more school, you see the Twelfth Step working at a level that's hard to describe. It's not about any one of us. It's about making sure that when someone finally wants help, they know AA exists and how to find us.

If you've been looking for a way to grow in service, come to a meeting. You just need to show up.

Stick with the winners.

If you always do what you always did, you'll always get what you always got.
