

SCIF STEP WORKING GUIDE AD HOC COMMITTEE

My affinity for the literature of our fellowship first developed while I was still at rehab. I would stay up late reading from the Big Book, and trying to map out what my future would look like. My love for the literature grew; so much so that I resolved to read every book Alcoholics Anonymous had ever written. I read almost every book they ever printed, but ultimately fell short when I realized that the Grapevine seemingly produced a new book once a month. So, when I heard about the Step Working Guide being developed by the Sonoma County Intergroup Fellowship (SCIF) I was excited to become a part of that process.

This new literature we are developing is still in its earliest phase, we are still working our way through Step One. **My intention is to honor the Big Book at every step, and draw from the Big Book for all inspiration. The Big Book will be our guiding light.** My vision is to comb the Big Book for every piece of actionable content therein - reference those sections by quotations (including page and number) - and then couple those quotes with questions that drill down into the spiritual principles underneath.

Obviously, honesty, is the primary spiritual principle for Step One. But there are lots of other spiritual principles that contribute to our development in the very beginning. Spiritual principles like willingness, acceptance, open mindedness, and surrender. These will all be addressed with questions that show you where in the book to find the answers, but also call upon the user to look into themselves and their experiences to reconcile what we are laying before them with their own truth. I'm hoping that what we create can become yet another tool or aid to assist an individual (in conjunction with our existing literature and the guidance of their sponsor) in working their steps.

Personally, I'm really enjoying reading (and re-reading) the Book and picking out all the areas that direct us through our step work. But there's a lot to this, and as of this writing we are sorely undersupported. Currently there are just two of us working to bring this Step Working Guide to completion. So, if you love the literature - and you love helping newcomers - and you love being of service - then join us on the first Tuesday (6pm) of every month at the SCIF meeting place next to the AA Bookstore on Mendocino Ave in Santa Rosa. **The more participation we have the broader our reach will become and the greater the impact made.**

Why I Do PI/CPC Work



As I go into my fourth year of being involved on the PI CPC service panel, I reflect back on where we were when I first joined in to help out . At that point in time there were two men who were doing it all to keep this part of General Service alive in Sonoma county . The pandemic and little interest had whittled down the volunteers that had come before them. I personally had no idea what this branch of A.A was up to.

I had heard in meetings that they were reaching out for help. My first reaction was that there are plenty of us available to participate, but because of my respect and admiration for the man asking for assistance, I begrudgingly let him know I would attend their business meeting on the second Wednesday of the month at the bookstore on Mendocino. We had some elections and got some positions filled but more than a few were open because we needed more volunteers.

At our last meeting on the 11th of March there were close to 20 participants, folks that have been here awhile and newcomers showing interest in PI CPC which stands for Public Information Cooperation with the Professional Community.

This branch shares and distributes literature throughout the county. They also share on zoom and in person at the county D.U.I program. They have recently revived the school presentations that were stopped during the pandemic. They are trying to find new avenues to share what A.A. is and what it is not . We have been reaching out to medical providers and business leaders to get out information.

We still are always looking for speakers to share in meetings and folks to distribute literature and help keep this committee humming. This panel that started in January of 2025 , will hold elections for new officers this coming December. Anyone who wants to jumpstart there A. A program with a different approach. Come on down and join us.
